



Our Worship in February

The month of February holds a variety of worship experiences for us. We will begin the month with a Service of Bread and Cup Communion. The second Sunday is an opportunity to hear about the Faith Expedition to Vietnam (details elsewhere in this newsletter). The season of Lent begins on February 21. An informal time of worship will be held at 6:30 pm on that day. Here is a brief outline for the month.

Anniversary Devotions

A devotional book, *Fresh from the Word*, celebrating the 300th anniversary of the Church of the Brethren may now be ordered. The book contains 366 devotions, one for each day of the anniversary year 2008. More than 100 writers, including Rebecca Lipscomb, are drawn from all six of the Brethren groups and from some of the countries beyond the US where Brethren are following Christ today. The devotions are "perpetually dated," and are not linked to the day of the week, so that the book can be reused in years to come. The volume is in hardcover, with a ribbon bookmark, and includes indexes of the writers and scriptures, and a family tree of the Brethren movement.

A pre-publication cost of \$12 (a 40% discount) is available on orders of 10 or more copies by March 15. Those interested in a copy are invited to sign-up at the church meetinghouse. No payment will be due until the books are received later in the year.



Reflections on Vietnam

On Sunday, February 11th, Dennis & Van Metzger and Fletcher Farrar will share during morning worship about their recent trip to Vietnam. A potluck lunch will follow the service and we hope to have Mary Jessup joining us. These four were in Vietnam from December 31 until January 12 as a part of a Church of the Brethren Witness/Washington Office sponsored Faith Expedition. They were able to visit several Church World Service projects and see firsthand some of the work being done, as well as participate in worship with Vietnamese Christians.

Kessler Begins Service to District

Kevin Kessler, pastor of the Canton Church of the Brethren for fourteen years, began serving the Illinois & Wisconsin District as District Executive/Minister on January 1, 2007. Kevin will serve as executive on a half-time basis, while continuing to serve the Canton congregation half-time. His executive/minister duties include, among other things, working with the District Leadership Team in administering various district ministries, assisting congregations with pastoral placement, providing oversight to the district office (which is still located in Lombard, IL), etc. Kevin will work from his office in Canton. Pastor Kres Receives Grant

Pastor Kres, along with four other Illinois & Wisconsin District pastors, received a grant to enter into the Sustaining Pastoral Excellence program sponsored by the Brethren Academy and funded by the Lily Foundation. Each of the five pastors received nearly \$5000 which will be used over a period of 18 months. Pastor Kres will join pastors Christy Walterdorff (York Center), Joel Kline (Highland Avenue, Elgin), Dennis Webb (Naperville), and Orlando Redekopp (Chicago, First) in an immersion retreat in San Francisco, CA., from March 5-14. During the retreat they will be meeting with San Francisco-area church leaders and resource people from the Pacific School of Religion.

The grant will cover immersion retreat expenses, technology, resources and travel for the eighteen months. Together they will explore ways to become more intentional in promoting joyous worship, active peacemaking, passionate faith, and spiritual maturity. In 2008 the five will be invited to share learnings and experiences with other pastors of different denominations in a national retreat.

Bonhoeffer's Life Together

You are invited to participate in a four-week discussion of Dietrich Bonhoeffer's book, *Life Together*. The book is Bonhoeffer's reflections and experience of Christian community as a part of the underground church movement during the Nazi years in Germany. In this brief book, Bonhoeffer explores what it means to live in community,

the importance of Christian service, the place for silence and meditation, etc.

Our discussions of the book will take place on four Tuesdays: February 6, 20, 27 and March 6. We will gather in the basement of the church meetinghouse at 7 pm.
